Tree	
Description	An erect conical shaped tree which has dark fissured bark which looks black at certain times of the year. This fast growing tree bears showy red male flowers in spring. The female has small spiky cones
Foliage	 Evergreen
Form	 Pendulous
Mature Size	10 x 4m
Uses	Excellent coastal wind break but also works in inland gardens or streetscapes. Great native replacement for a pine tree.
Position & Soil	Hardy in most soils and positions. Grows fastest in a full sun position and some irrigation during establishment. Can tolerate shallow well drained sites. It can grow both on coastal sites in inland positions.
