Description	<p>Eucalyptus macrandra is a tall shrub or medium mallee tree with greyish smooth bark which sheds during late summer and autumn. The revealed new bark is greenish-brown to brown. The leaves are lanceolate, leathery and bright green. Lemon yellow-coloured flowers emerge from elongated buds between December and March and are filled with nectar, making them attractive to native birds and insects.</p>

Uses	<p>The variety is small enough to be accommodated in a residential setting or other urban plantings such as parks and recreational reserves. A very useful eucalypt it can be used as a street or feature tree.</p>
Position & Soil	<p>This tree is tolerant of most soil types but prefers an open, well drained site in full sun to part shade.</p>
